# A RECIPE OF LOVE AND SPECIAL SAUCE

f the name Garrett Dutton is unfamiliar to you, perhaps you know him better by his musical moniker as lead singer of G. Love & Special Sauce, which brought songs like "Cold Beverage" and "Baby's Got Sauce" to mainstream music in the early '90s.

During the last 25 years, G. Love has been entertaining crowds with his rapping skills, harmonica playing and bluesy guitar, combining them all in genre that's unique.

On January 31st, G. Love & Special Sauce will stop at The Hamilton in D.C., as part of its 25 year anniversary, with a tour entitled,

"The Sauce Tour: A Celebration of 25 Years."

Joining G. Love are Jim Prescott (a.k.a. Jimi Jazz) on bass, and Jeffrey Clemens (a.k.a. Houseman) on drums. The trio has been gathering a faithful tribe of acolytes for a quarter of a century with their joyously off-kilter performances and love of all things funky.

G. Love began his musical career performing on the streets of Philadelphia and termed his style as "hip hop blues."

"When I started, I was playing the Delta blues but I grew up listening to Run D.M.C. and the Beastie Boys and that sort of music was always in me, I just didn't do it when I played out," he says. "One night I was playing out by South Street, working on this guitar riff and I just started rapping the lyrics to this old Eric B. and Rakim tune called 'Paid in Full.'"

Lost in the sound, G. Love realized that this is what he should be playing.

"I remember thinking, 'I'm like the only white boy sitting on the street with an acoustic guitar rapping over it," he says. "No one was really doing this at the time."

Not long after, he teamed with Clemens on drums and Shanko and G. Love & Special Sauce has gone pretty much unchanged over years with only Mark Boyce on keyboards coming and going.

At the Hamilton show, the hits will be played along with a good selection of songs off their last album, and even a few covers mixed in.

These days, G. Love likes to stay close to his fans on social media sites and uploads videos and songs regularly to sites like Twitter and YouTube.

"They give you a platform to be as creative as you want," he says. "You can do something different than what you do on stage or in the studio, and it happens so fast, you don't have to talk to your manager first. It's something I have fun with and let's me know what my fans want to hear, what they like and what they don't like."

"It's essential. Ever since I started writing songs when I was 15, I had this knee jerk reaction to want to record them and perform them in front of people," he says. "I have to perform. I love being on stage and making the people feel good. Something different happens with your whole psyche and you have to prove it to yourself every night and be wide open and pull something out."

G. Love has never had a problem with that and can't wait to be in D.C. with his signature "Special Sauce" recipe of fun.

"It's a really fun show and we're really interested in keeping it loose and funky right now," he says. "When people are paying their hard-earned money to see you, you always play what people want to hear. They are the one's playing you at home, in the car, at the dinner table, at the barbecue. You know, you're a part of their life and we want to keep it that way."





# NEW YEAR, NEW YOU

If you're like most Americans, the word that best describes the past few months of holiday merry-making is "indulgent." Which was great fun while it lasted, but the arrival of 2019 serves as a reminder that it's time to shift to healthier habits while offering the perfect opportunity to hit the refresh button on mind, body and spirit. So how do you get back on track after the holiday hiatus and actually make your motivation—and your resolutions—go the distance?

According to statistics, almost half will give up on their goals within six months. Avoid being one of them. If you've vowed to look better, feel better and live healthier in 2019, these eight tips from the experts will help you achieve your goal. Little things can make a big difference, and these small changes are no exception.



#### 1. STOP DIETING



A perennial resolution chart-topper, year after year many of us make the same old plans to slash our caloric intake. There's evidence, however, that restrictive dieting doesn't lead to weight loss, and instead typically leads to long-term weight gain. If you have pounds to shed and need the structure of a formal "diet", consider the DASH diet, a flexible and balanced lifetime eating plan proven to lower blood pressure and cholesterol, reduce the risk of depression and manage weight. This Mediterranean-inspired eating plan has been highly praised by researchers and ranked "Best Diet" 8 years in a row by US News and World Report. The simplest approach of all, however, and one that all experts favor, is just eating "real food"—meaning reducing and/or eliminating prepared and processed foods from your everyday meals-and keeping track of your portions.

#### 2. EAT YOUR VEGGIES



It's probably not news that eating fruits and vegetables is a must for good health. What you might not know is that the more researchers learn about the relationship between the gut and the brain, the more evidence there is that nutrition is a key factor in your mental health, too. People who consume more fruits and vegetables don't only have more beautiful bodies, but also lower levels of depression than those who eat less of the "good stuff". Low in calories, high in vitamins, minerals, phytochemicals, and fiber, 6 half-cup servings of vegetables and 1 ½ to 2 cups of fruit per day is the target, which means you should be enjoying at least a couple of servings at each and every meal.

#### 3. MOVE YOUR BODY



It doesn't matter if you're walking around your neighborhood or running a marathon—any sort of movement is going to help you. And as if weight reduction wasn't benefit enough, exercise is one of the most effective ways of improving your heart health, upping your sex drive, improving your sleep, boosting your mood and maintaining cognitive function. Adhering to an exercise plan, however, can be hard. This new year, aim to identify the exercise you find enjoyable, that gets you out socializing, and that allows you to build competence as these are the activities and routines you're most likely to stick with.

To provide motivation to actually get out of bed and complete your daily workout, walk, run, or swim, experts suggest working towards a goal (like a race), training with a friend, or adding in an element of competition. Adding new activities to your routine, like hiking and mountain biking, can elevate your fitness while getting you more connected with the outdoors. And during these winter months, activities like sledding, cross country skiing and ice skating—even snowball fighting and building a snowman—can burn anywhere from 340 to 450 calories an hour.

It's important to remember that the gym is not the be-all and end-all when it comes to exercise. You can get in a workout virtually anywhere. Do push-ups and leg lifts at your kitchen counter while waiting for coffee to brew. Get in your cardio with a brisk lunchhour walk or an afterschool dance party with your kids. Do sit-ups during TV commercials. If you make yourself active during all of your extra minutes, you'll stay on track for a stronger, fitter you. And injecting movement into packed calendars by exercising in short bursts can be just as beneficial for your health as one long session, says research from Arizona State University in Phoenix. For example, the free 20-minute yoga or Pilates workouts on FitnessBlender.com are not only easy to squeeze into your schedule, but have the added benefit of being restorative exercises that help you decompress from a stressful day while keeping you moving.

#### 4. BUY A REUSABLE WATER BOTTLE



Water is essential to good health, yet most of us fall short of the "8 glasses a day" rule. Drinking water encourages better digestion and blood flow, improves skin tone and texture, and keeps your body from hoarding fat by regulating body temperature. Along with a push for increased physical activity in 2019, make sure you're upping your water intake to cover the extra fluid loss. And while you're hydrating, help the planet by opting for a reusable water bottle, which can translate into personal savings (the average American wastes about \$266 a year on bottled water, according to the Earth Day Network) as well as planetary savings since the average American uses 167 disposable water bottles yearly, but only recycles 38. Who knows, you just might find yourself showing off that stylish reusable bottle at the gym a bit more often.

#### 5. BREATHE



It sounds counterintuitive to remember to breathe, but it really is so important. Proper breathing is essential during exercise. During aerobic activities, such as running or swimming, a good breathing pattern ensures that your working muscles will continue to receive the oxygen they need to keep contracting. According to researchers at the University of New Mexico, proper breathing is also central to nonaerobic forms of exercise, including weightlifting, yoga, tai chi and Pilates. Even taking a few meditative deep breaths throughout your day can help you relax and find more presence and peace, especially in tough situations.

#### **6. REDUCE SCREEN TIME**



For most of us, a large part of our day requires us to look at a screen of some description. Excessive screen time not only affects posture, mood, and sleep quality, but potentially can cause eye damage as well. Unfortunately, many favorite leisure activities such as TV binging, movie viewing and gaming can also add to the amount of time spent passively watching a display. While it's impossible to completely escape our devices, large or small, there are ways to reduce the time you place your eyes and brain under the screen strain. Reducing screen time is one answer. #### 7. CATCH SOME Zzzzzzzs



Have you ever thought that sleep can help your exercise routine? The answer is YES! There is a proven correlation between sleep and exercise, with each one impacting the other. When you don't get adequate sleep, it can result in poor exercise performance and even weight gain. Conversely, there's evidence that sleeping well can result in more productive exercise, as well as exercise helping to improve sleep quality. The research is clear: you really can't get by on just a few hours of

sleep—the vast majority of us need an average of eight hours a night. Make this the one to get right in 2019 because getting enough sleep makes it easier to avoid cravings for unhealthy foods, keep off excess weight, and maintain your best emotional health.

#### 8. TAKE CARE OF YOURSELF



This year make a shift in your concept of "me time". This is the moment to stop resisting what your mind may tell you is just being "lazy" and finally do the things that are just for you and contribute to your wellbeing. It's easy to get caught up in the whirlwind of work emails, after-school carpool schedules and life's countless obligations. Spending at least 10 minutes daily on quality, mindful "me-time"—such as reading for pleasure, meditating or playing with a pet—allows you to focus not only on feeling good, but also reduces stress and improves your well being. 

# Ask DR. DIMA COOLSCULPTING V. ULTRASHAPE

There is a saying in medicine: "if you ask 10 doctors you'll get 10 different answers." I often get asked my opinion about the most effective non-invasive technologies, both by patients and by colleagues. We're all pretty opinionated about our beliefs but sometimes I take the extra time to convince people about one technology over another. Whether to get CoolSculpting or UltraShape Power is one such instance. I have a lot of experience with both, including having had both treatments myself. Here are the main reasons I favor UltraShape Power over CoolSculpting for non-invasive body sculpting.

## What are the main differences in how these two technologies work?

Both technologies are categorized as non-invasive body contouring treatments but they do have significant differences that are worth considering. As the name implies, CoolSculpting uses freezing to target fat cells that are destroyed and eliminated by the body over several weeks. UltraShape uses ultrasound technology to essentially do the same thing.

this side effect began a few days after treatment with CoolSculpt and took weeks to resolve.

## Are both technologies safe and painless?

Here is where I have a somewhat unyielding opinion. Whereas UltraShape is completely painless, CoolSculpting is uncomfortable but, more importantly, I think CoolSculpting has residual side effects that warrant closer evaluation. It has been documented in the medical literature that CoolSculpting can have a very painful residual side effect that resembles neuropathic pain. I personally suffered from this after an abdominal treatment. It was debilitating to say the least and ultimately required anesthesia just to get me through the day. On the other hand, Ultrasound technology can distinguish between different kinds of tissue. Freezing cannot. Freezing fat also freezes blood vessels and nerves which, in

my opinion leads to the neuropathic pain that some patients experience after this treatment. With UltraShape, there is no damage to surrounding tissue and hence no discomfort or recovery.

## Can CoolSculpting treat my arm fat or bra bulge?

Simply put, no. Ultrashape can target hard to reach areas that CoolSculpting cannot. For example, the back of arms and fat around the knees.

# How long do these procedures take and how long will it take me to see results?

You need a much longer time commitment when getting CoolSculpting treatment. Expect to spend up to 6 hours or more depending on the body areas being targeted vs. an hour to an hour and a half with UltraShape Power. Another advantage of Ultrashape is that results are visible much faster than with CoolSculpting—just a few weeks vs months and the results I've seen are far better with UltraShape Power.



#### **Brushes**







Few bars in Northern Virginia have as long a history as JV's. Located in what might be the oldest standing strip mall on the Virginia side of the beltway where Annandale Road intersects Arlington Boulevard in Falls Church, JV's was founded in 1947 by owner Lorraine Campbell's father George Dross and his brother Bill.

he pair founded the restaurant (then known as "Jeffferson's") after serving in World War II for Greece and because of the family's military heritage, the restaurant has a long tradition as a haven for military veterans. Under Campbell's direction, the bar is continuously raising money for homeless and wounded veterans, and launching drives to mail care packages for troops in Iraq. She also is passionate about suicide prevention for patriots and others. She has assisted the U.S. Veteran's Affairs Department with distributing informational pamphlets to veterans. And if you're not sure how to donate, you can always throw money in the donation box.

A lot of the tradition was started by George. During World War II, George and Bill relied on international co-operation to get through the war. George assisted British paratroopers and hosted American troops while stationed in Greece and was rescued by American troops during his two stints as a prisoner-of-war. In that same spirit, George and Bill would always welcome other veterans at their establishment and do what they could to welcome camaraderie.

"He was very thankful to be alive and be free and thankful to the U.S. military and that's where the camaraderie came from. His whole family felt that way. They would hide the American soldiers during the war and nurse them back to health," explained Campbell.

Lorraine took over operations in 1985 upon the death of her father with her sister Pauline Anson-Dross as a silent partner. She has continued the tradition of welcoming veterans. On Memorial Day Weekend, JV's has been an unofficial home for Rolling Thunder's Ride for Freedom since its inception. During the weekend, JV's throws a free buffet for the veterans and for people who want to honor them.

The other claim to fame for JV's is their live music. Lorraine and Pauline grew up with Hank Williams, Chubby Checker, Elvis, Fats Domino and swing as their primary influences and Lorraine curates a roster of artists that consists primarily of classic rock, blues, country, and bluegrass. She used to play there with Roy Dixon.

In the past year, JV's musical has expanded both their floor space and their calendar. Since 1990, the establishment has had live shows seven days a week. Another difference is that the bookings have gotten a lot easier on Lorraine

"Now, the talent comes to me, they know who we are and it's a lot more nationallyknown artists," said Campbell.

Guests who have come to JV's include the Clintons, Chicago Mayor Rahm Emmanuel, with performers that have included bluegrass legend Tony Rice, actor Dan Aykroyd, Allman Brothers band member Michael Allman, and Johnny Rawls. Additionally, 1950s pop singer Eddie Fisher (best known as part of the love triangle between Debbie Reynolds and Elizabeth Taylor and as Carrie Fisher's father) used to stop by daily and have his breakfast with George when he was stationed at Fort Myer in the 1950s.

One of the highlights for Lorraine is sister Pauline Anson-Dross who performs regularly at JV's in the six-member women's band "Wicked Jezabel" with wife Davi Anson-Dross.

For Lorraine, however, the most rewarding guests are the long-time clients who have watched her grow up along with the restaurant through multiple generations of management. She went to college for computer science but feels, because she is a "people person," that this restaurant is her version of "the American dream."

The restaurant's unofficial slogan is "Ageless charm without yuppie bastardization" and Campbell is careful to note that that distinction is not an attack on any age group.

"It doesn't have to do with people. It's just who we are. It's more of a corporate thing. We're not like a Ruby Tuesdays or Chilli's or Applebee's. We're the real deal," she said.

Whether it's as a place where younger veterans can glean the wisdom of older veterans or as a musical scene where people of all ages can appreciate oldies, Campbell believes JV's thrives as a place where multiple generations come together.

## New Trends for Virginia Wineries

Wine Lovers and Beer Lovers Can Now Enjoy Tastings Together

Love wine? Love beer? Love both? Check out the new trends in Virginia's wine community that are opening up the industry to even more people, opportunities...and animals.

#### Breweries and Wineries Side By Side

One trend we're starting to see is Virginia wineries offering a selection of craft beer and wine on the same premises, thanks to a ruling change. Three local favorites are already on board: Hillsborough Winery, Brewery & Vineyard; Barrel Oak Winery and the Barrel Oak Farm Taphouse; and Quattro Goomba's Winery and Brewery, now licensed as farm breweries as well as farm wineries. This means they can serve both wine and beer in their tasting rooms.

"In 2014, the General Assembly passed the law allowing the new licensing designation for farm breweries; before

that, they were commercial and had to have separate facilities," explained Brian Roeder, founder/proprietor at Barrel Oak, one of the people behind the law change, and the first to get the farm brewery license.

"Prior to this law change, you had to have separate ABC licenses," added Kerem Baki, General Manager of Wine Production at

Hillsborough. "If I had my farm winery license posted in my winery tasting room, I couldn't have a brewery license as well. Now the law allows co-inhabitation of two different licenses and that wine and beer

can be served and enjoyed side by side in the tasting rooms."

#### Newly Opened Hillsborough Brewery

Since licensing laws also require that production be done on site for a farm brewery license, Hillsborough dedicated a separate building for its brewery, opening it in October 2018. The brewery and winery are run by two brothers: Kerem and Tolga Baki. Kerem is the winemaker who creates hand-crafted wines from grapes grown on the property, while brewmaster Tolga produces unique craft beers in the brewery located just down the hill from the original tasting room. The Hillsborough brewery currently offers five beer varieties: Pilsner

Lager, Farmhouse Ale (aged in wine barrels), English-style IPA, Brown Ale, and Belgian Blonde.

Once a month, Hillsborough offers a guided tour of the winery and brewery, along with a different educational seminar and opportunities to meet with the winemaker and brewmaster. (Reservations recommended.) "We get about 30-40 people each day," Kerem Baki said.



Virginia's Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) reported in 2018 that Virginia now had 352 wineries and 262 breweries. Sixty two distilleries were also recorded.



A new Virginia law, effective January 1, 2019, requires that when a brewery licensee retails brands of beer that the brewery owns, at least 20% of that volume of beer sold for on-premises consumption in that calendar year be manufactured on premises.

Tastings of beer or wine (no mixed flights) are held in the historic tasting room, and beer and wine dinners are planned, along with a beer club to accompany the wine club.

#### Barrel Oak Farm Taphouse

"Our goal is not to become a big brewery, but rather, to provide customers with an enhanced experience when they come here," Roeder said. "I wondered if the clientele would be fundamentally different and would clash, but it doesn't clash at all...they love it. It expanded our customer base and was very well received."

To qualify as a farm winery or farm brewery, a percentage of the ingredients for the product must be grown on the property. With Virginia's climate, the most-often grown crop for brewing is hops, which visitors can see along with grapevines. "Coming to a winery gives you an entirely different experience than going to a town brewery," he continued. "Here, you enjoy the land and the beautiful views, and see where the hops and vines are grown."

Barrel Oak features a 10-barrel brewery and serves a Kölsch, IPA (Gold Award winner), Winter Amber, Irish Red, Saison, Belgian Dubbel and more. The brewery is located underneath the taproom, build right into the hillside, and beer runs up refrigerated lines right to the taproom. Barrel Oak also offers clubs for its wine and beer lovers.

Quattro Goomba is the third winery with a brewery on site. Its brewery opened with a commercial license that required wine and beer to be consumer in separate locations. After their licensing change, they can now offer enjoyment of their craft beers and wines in both tasting rooms.

#### Dogs Allowed

As of July 1, 2018, new legislation states that companion dogs are now allowed in ABC-licensed distilleries, wineries and breweries in Virginia. This was another rule change initiated by Brian Roeder and is good news for those who enjoy traveling with their four-footed friends.

The existing law, Section 3.2-5115 of the Code of Virginia, was amended to state that while dogs are still not allowed in areas where their presence is likely to result in contamination of food, food contact surfaces or food packaging materials, they will be allowed within a designated area inside of or on the premises of a winery, brewery or distillery. The tasting room must be separated from the food preparation areas, and manufacturing and storage areas must be enclosed and separate.

This new legislation does not, however, require an establishment to allow dogs, with the exception of service animals. The previous law stated that no animals were allowed in areas used for food manufacturing, with the exception of guard or guide animals.

As Virginia's wine and beer industries continue to grow, they also continue to evolve, offering more and more options for wine and beer lovers alike.












hoof impatiently in an attempt to expedite the carrot-feeding process by novice citydwellers, as Exo and Petrus patiently await their turn. Shaggy winter-coated Shetland ponies Penny and Tucker trot up eagerly, bursting with enthusiasm at the prospect.

Fancy-crested chickens cavort in the yard, hence the supply of farm-fresh eggs. A trail will loop you back around to the serene pool, whose graceful mermaid enjoys a backdrop of Virginia's undulating Blue Ridge. Sit a spell in the gazebo.

While away the afternoon in an overstuffed armchair, sipping Lady Grey tea by the hearth in the oak-panelled, timber-ceilinged Hunt Room to the smooth classics of jazz in anticipation of your delectable 5-course dinner. Murals of lively beagles and the handsome family of the manor on horseback

grace the walls. Imagine live music emanating from the minstrel gallery in the alcove above as in bygone days.

Resident celebrity Chef Dayn Smith has been an executive chef at restaurants in the US, Puerto Rico, and Switzerland. Both he and his son Lindell studied at the Culinary Institute of America in Upstate New York. This is where culinary innovation meets classic cuisine — all with the freshest ingredients from local organic farms.

Start with a refreshing baby beet salad Montrachet with microgreens, caramelized pecans, and aged balsamic paired with a Villa Viva Côtes de Thau 2017 from Languedoc-Roussillon, followed by a velvety Carrot Ginger Soup with Crème Fraiche Espuma and toasted coconut. Next up, ahi tuna ceviche adorned with fried plantain and wasabi ice cream, paired with an André Brunel Domaine de la Becassonne 2015 Côtes du Rhône.

As the guest celebrating her birthday wished everyone at dinner, "I hope you all had good days." A nice sentiment indeed. Places such as these engender such conviviality. Indeed, I hope all of you have good days too.

She raved about the carrot-ginger soup, an opinion which everyone shared. "This is so good, I wish I could bathe in it!" she gushed.

For more than 30 years, the Unity Club in Falls Church has provided an important and vital meeting place for those in Northern Virginia, who need a little help to get through their days.

Located at 116B West Broad St., the Unity Club offers a home for Alcoholic Anonymous and other 12-Step recovery programs, with a wide variety of meetings that take place from 6 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. daily, 365 days a year.

According to Karl E Hoffman, the Unity Club's executive director, this 501(c)(3) organization provides the newly recovering alcoholic a safe, comfortable, sanctuary while offering more established 12-Step followers a variety of meeting types and schedule convenience.

The non-profit partners with The City of Falls Church, Fairfax County, and Arlington County, in addition to local substance abuse treatment centers

and mental health facilities, to provide a reliable facility to introduce patients and clients to the long-term recovery techniques embodied in Twelve-Step fellowships.

The meetings are there to provide support, knowledge and information about recovery from compulsive disorders through discussion groups and lectures, as part of a voluntary mental health care program.

With 120 12-Step meetings per week—20 programs being offered, for everything from eating disorders to sex & love addicts to survivors of incest—the Unity Club is there to help anyone with recovery and has experts on hand to make sure that no one needs to go through this pain alone.

The complete list of fellowship consists of AA (Alcoholics Anonymous); ACA (Adult Children of Alcoholics); CLA (Clutterers Anonymous); EDA (Eating

Disorders Anonymous); NA (Narcotics Anonymous); SIA (Survivors of Incest Anonymous); ADA (Affective Disorders Anonymous); CoDA (Codependants Anonymous); FA (Food Addicts in Recovery Anonymous); OA (Overeaters Anonymous); SLAA (Sex & Love Addicts Anonymous); Al (Anon/AlaTeen); DA (Debtors Anonymous); MA (Marijuana Anonymous); SCA (Sexual Compulsives Anonymous); and WA (Workaholics Anonymous).

As one recent attendee said: "Broke and new to recovery, I came to my first meeting on Saturday. An hour-and-a-half later I was still broke, but had an experienced sponsor, a Big Book, and hope. I surely had some hope."

Following the holidays, those involved with Unity Club know that it can be a lonely or difficult time for many, and invite anyone who feels like they need some help, want to talk, or just want to listen to come on by as their doors are open. •





# LOVE IT OR LIST IT?

### Should you improve your current home or look for a new one?

your house just doesn't suit your family any more. Is it time to move to a new home? Or are there things you can do to make your existing home work?

If you've ever watched the popular HGTV television show "Love It or List It," you've seen couples facing this same decision. In the show, couples are presented with two situations: to find a new home with real estate agent David Visentin, or trust interior designer Hilary Farr to renovate their existing space. After renovations are completed, the homeowners are given a tour of their current home to see what Farr was able to do within their budget. Then they are asked to either "Love It," meaning they will stay in their current home, or "List It," meaning they will sell their house and purchase one of the homes Visentin has shown them.

Homeowners here in Northern Virginia face the same dilemma. They may love where they are, but the house is older and doesn't fit what they need now. Here are some of the benefits of renovating.

"Some of the unforeseen costs of moving include: hiring a realtor and paying both sides of the transaction (possibly 6% of the sales price), fees for selling and closing on a home, moving costs and taxes. By the end of it all, you're looking at 8-9% of the sales price to move. For a \$500,000 house, this can add up to around \$45,000 in costs," explained Graham Pruitt, Senior Loan Officer at MVB Mortgage. "This is in addition to the fact that you must start over with a new neighborhood and neighbors, the hassle of moving, and time you have to take off from work."

"This is money you don't have to spend on moving," Pruitt continued. "You can put that same money into a brand new kitchen, bath, cabinets, appliances or flooring, for example, or take out a construction loan using the equity in your home to renovate or expand the footprint with an addition."

Your mortgage loan officer will review your credit, what you owe currently, and the value of your property after the renovation. This helps determine how much can be loaned and how much cash the homeowner must have on hand. Once the numbers are determined and conditions are met, the loan is closed and construction begins.

Under a construction loan, the lending institution creates the milestone and payment schedules for the builder. "This helps protect homeowners—and our investment—against the builder not performing the way they should, materials costing more, the job taking longer, or the homeowner not being happy with the work. We won't release money to the builder if the job isn't up to standards," Pruitt said. "It also protects the homeowner from being taken advantage of by the builder."

With a construction loan, you are essentially looking at a refinancing of your current mortgage, with the exception that construction loan fees are much lower than a standard refinance. For example, there are no mortgage recording fees. It will slightly increase the mortgage amount going forward, but saves the homeowner from having to use cash from a savings or retirement account.

If the house is already paid off, the homeowner can take out a mortgage or a home equity line of credit (HELOC) to do the job. "If it is a large project, the HELOC can be risky because the interest rate on that money is not fixed—it is variable. And its interest may not be deductible as it is on a mortgage," Pruitt advises.

"People buy a home because of location, and want to stay there because they like their community, church, neighbors, commute, and proximity to the city," said Deirdre McSorley, Business Development Manager of Schroeder Design/Build. "It may be cheaper to stay in their house now with what is left on the mortgage, and forego the increased costs of starting over with a new, possibly more expensive mortgage. And when people move to a new home to meet their needs, they may get some of the needs of their wish list, but not all of them. If you stay in your home and customize it, you'll definitely get what you want and need."

"We're seeing a lot of homeowners adding space to allow additional loved ones to move in. They are renovating their area above a garage or downstairs, or creating an addition," McSorley said. "One big trend is to take out walls to create an open floor plan for entertaining, centering the home around the kitchen instead of having segregated rooms. We're also seeing people turning decks and screen porches into four-season rooms."

"There are a lot more possibilities than people think, and it may not cost as much as they assume because we may have a creative solution. Don't throw in the towel too soon," McSorley recommends.

The least expensive renovation, according to McSorley, is an interior remodel as opposed to adding to the footprint and dealing with foundational issues. "Ideally, we want to ask 'What is the function you want' and 'What is not working,' as opposed to 'What do you want to do?' As a true design/build firm, we can find a solution."

Other options for renovations include creating an area that can be converted to income-producing property; adding luxury features into kitchens, baths, closets and master suites; or creating cool spaces for exercise or gaming.

When facing the question of "love it or list it," think about how you can redesign your home, and how you can create just what you want and need without having to move right away. A home renovation will not only improve your living space, it will also increase the resale value of your home should you wish to list it in the future. ❖

# Cook's Choice

### Integrated Indoor/Outdoor Solution Perfect for Entertaining In Every Season

An indoor/outdoor solution that seamlessly integrates a mid-1960's split level to its leafy half acre lot with pool has handily satisfied the dual entertainment requirements of a Falls Church couple keen on gourmet cooking and partying with friends and family.

The remodeling to the home of Dave and Amy Starr reconciles a regimen of spaceplanning, interior design and functional considerations that had materialized as the home aged, and the owner's needs became more refined.

"Our 25 year old kitchen was too dark and cramped," says Dave Starr, 60, who has occupied the house since the early 1990's. "Also, the outdoor kitchen adjacent to the pool had deteriorated to the point where we weren't really using it."

Among the more glaring problems:

Owing to limited storage, the original 160 square foot kitchen was too

- cramped and cluttered—which made meal preparation cumbersome;
- Sightlines from the kitchen to the pool via windows above the sink were seriously truncated; the kitchen was usually quite dark;
- Service to a front-facing formal dining room five linear feet from the kitchen was not well-conceived;
- While the in-ground pool was a featured attraction, surrounding patios and walkways were no longer level in many places;
- The outdoor kitchen which centered around a gas grill had fallen into disrepair;
- Guests could not enter the pool area directly from the kitchen, but had to circuit through an adjacent family room;

Similarly, limited service options to the family room restricted its usefulness as a place to entertain.

In search of a more functional and aesthetically-pleasing environment, the Starrs turned to Sun Design Remodeling, the firm that had previously executed three large-scale improvements to their home starting with a redesigned front elevation ten years ago.

The makeover subsequently won a "Contractor of the Year" (COTY) Award ("Best Addition under \$250,000.00")

The Starrs next hired the firm to upgrade the home's lower level and design and install a new adjoining staircase.

"We've followed a slow-but-steady whole house renovation course" Dave Starr says. "Sun Design has been consistently sensitive to our budget, and finds solutions my wife and I could not have discovered on our own. Since we knew this recent project would entail a lot of challenges, we were confident that the high-quality collaboration we had enjoyed earlier would continue and didn't feel a need to talk to any other remodelers."

Among the critical design issues, Starr wanted to better rationalize the kitchen's tight footprint without adding-on; he also envisioned a more fluid relationship between the kitchen and poolside setting.

"The outdoor kitchen was not being used much," Starr recalls. "Because my wife and I love cooking and entertaining, we wanted a plan that would fluidly interact with several rooms in the rear of the house."

To keep the project on track, Sun Design tapped Erica Williams—one of their top lead designers—to direct the process.

"The primary goal was to create a stronger visual and physical connectivity between the house and grounds," Williams observes. "This meant introducing an appreciably open plan in the rear of the house. The advantage of transitional style is that it employs textures, colors and design elements to help to highlight activity zones...reducing the need for gratuitous walls. This sharpens sightlines from room to



room while preserving the fundamentals of what makes a quiet spot feel private."

On this score, Williams' plan called for relocating the kitchen sink on the home's rear elevation and replacing a pair of small windows with a 8-foot wide sliding glass door that directly accesses the pool.

A 6' x 4' granite-topped food prep island equipped with sink, microwave drawer and dishwasher was introduced mid-kitchen; the custom built-in is integral to a new work triangle that brings the cooktop range and a 42" wide Sub-Zero refrigerator into close proximity.

Meanwhile, by rerouting HVAC ducting and deleting some bulkheads, Williams was able to replace existing 36" cabinetry with taller 42" units surfaced in natural maple.

The reconfigured kitchen floorplan allocates the space needed for a tea and coffee center a few feet from of the breakfast table.

Removing a refrigerator on the left side of the old kitchen sink, in turn, freed-up the wall space needed to form a "pass-thru" that now unifies the kitchen and the family room.

Eliminating a small mid-house closet, likewise, allowed Williams to introduce a dry bar which now functions as a serving station for the formal dining room. The built-in provides cabinetry for linens and stemware, and accommodates a wine refrigerator.



To better incorporate an intrusive midkitchen micro-laminated beam, Williams clad the exposed support in Arizona cypress (the same wood used on wall surfaces) and wiredin LED lights for added illumination.

Outside, the plan called for a welcoming spot to barbecue and converse with guests.





Situated on a flagstone platform, the new outdoor kitchen features a pizza oven, a gas grill and a three-stool dining counter.

The oven's cladding is stacked stone veneer; counter surfaces are Dakton, a synthetic material designed for outdoor use.

Changes to the rear elevation have radically improved the accessibility of the outdoor cooking facility from the kitchen. Dave Starr says he is able to use the outdoor grill and oven most of the year—even in the winter.

The plan is especially useful for smoking meats, roasting vegetables and, particularly, making pizza and other baked goods.

In all, a great place to spend quality time—in anticipation of an early Spring



B azin's On Church has been a fixture on the restaurant scene for thirteen years, and it ranks as one of the neighborhood's most beloved places to gather for special occasions and to meet friends at the restaurant's lively bar. Patrick and Julie Bazin opened their Fairfax fine dining restaurant to rave reviews, winning best new restaurant in 2010 from *Northern Virginia Magazine* and serving a menu of American classics with signature flourishes and Instagramworthy presentations.

Patrick Bazin has been cooking since he was sixteen, when he began his career in his family's restaurant business. He moved to Washington D.C. to open the restaurant Red Sage and later became head chef at the Occidental. Eventually, he and his wife decided to debut their own restaurant in Fairfax County—Bazin's on Church—on Church Street in Vienna, Virginia.

For years, Patrick had been swallowing antacids every day, while he dealt with a sometimes severely upset stomach. He didn't investigate further until a colonoscopy eight years ago, which turned up a shocking diagnosis. The celebrated chef had Celiac Disease.



No one likes to give up foods like pizza, bread and pasta, but for Patrick's long-term health, he needed to cut out all wheat, barley and oats from his diet. Celiac is a gluten-sensitive enteropathy, or an immune reaction to eating the protein found in wheat, barley and rye. Eating gluten products when you have Celiac affects the small intestine, making it impossible to gain the nutrients from those foods. It often causes bouts of diarrhea, fatigue, weight loss, bloating and anemia. In children, gluten allergies can affect growth and development. In adults with gluten sensitivities, they may experience rashes, mouth ulcers, headaches and loss of bone density.

Patrick took the situation very seriously and eliminated all gluten products from his diet. While he felt much better, he missed the sensation of crunchy, chewy and crispy he found in foods on his verboten list. "People with Celiac are dying for a crunch, so I started to experiment with different flours. Now I use rice flour, gluten-free panko crumbs, and pasta made with corn and gluten free breads," Patrick explains. "My veal Parmesan holds up well with these new flours."

Bazin's on Church has a private dining venue next door to the restaurant where they host corporate events, wine dinners and theme nights. He purchased dedicated fryers and eliminates gluten contamination to host a monthly gluten free dinner in this elegant space. "For these monthly dinners, people with gluten allergies really gravitate to me," says Patrick. "These people trust me because I have street cred. They believe in me since I've been gluten free myself for so long."

In the meal, Patrick found ways to make spring rolls that are gluten free using rice flour. "It's fantastic," Patrick tells me. "It's really good, crunchy and super crispy. I keep coming up with recipes using this flour." He makes his signature dish, Broccoli Frito with rice flour batter and then fries it so it comes out with the texture of Tempura. "People usually don't get to eat fried foods when they're gluten free, because most fryers are cross contaminated with gluten products. We have a dedicated fryer for that."

Bazin's also hosts a Mexican dinner once a month, and most of those dishes are gluten free. "Tve always gravitated to Mexican, and it was probably because they don't have much gluten in their dishes, like mole, corn tortillas. I never got sick eating that. Bazin's Mexican night has six appetizers and five entrees. Before we prepare the food, we scrub down the kitchen."

Patrick has seen a positive response to these dinners, and he is moved by it. "People have been thanking me. They say, 'No one else is doing this,' and they come to me with smiles on their faces. They ask me to talk to their kids when they're first diagnosed with Celiac. I would eventually like to

teach these techniques so other people can do it at home," says Patrick.

One big problem Patrick sees is that most kids aren't learning to cook for themselves. They mostly eat at fast casual restaurants, which seldom offer gluten free options. "They're forgetting what real food is. All that gluten is mixed in, so you can go out and eat, and then get really sick."


This is especially true once you've eliminated gluten from your diet for a while; people become highly sensitive to gluten when it's out of their diet. It's a serious situation when it's hidden in some foods. Patrick says he became extremely ill on his birthday, because he didn't realize gluten was in something he ordered. "It scared my wife and kids to see me so sick," he remembers. One of the most effective ways to avoid allergic reactions to gluten, like vomiting and diarrhea, is to learn to cook yourself. "I advise people to learn to cook to better understand their condition."

For Patrick's Pop Up Nights, he's busy cooking, but because it's an open kitchen, many people come up to ask him what is safe to eat. "People ask me questions all the time. I tell them bone broth is really good for us. I make it with turkey, beef shank and chicken, then I add porcini mushrooms for that umami. I let it cook about 48 hours. You can do so much with it, like stew, soups and tea. I make this French Onion soup with brazed short ribs and Parmesan cheese. It has so much depth."

Patrick says there are many new products available for people with a gluten allergy. "It used to be you got a piece of meat or fish on a salad, but now that the condition is mainstream enough that people are more aware of it than ever before. There are 40 million people with gluten intolerance, and if you eat gluten, it hurts your other organs." One reason he thinks this sensitivity to gluten has become more common is the increasing amount of genetic modification in products we eat. People have a hard time digesting it, he believes.

Does life change a lot when you've cut gluten from your diet? The chef says he used to drink bold red wines, but now he has a taste for lighter vintages like Pinot Noir. As a trailblazer in the gluten-free arena, he's taken on this challenge and is helping others who struggle to make






changes in their diet. It's important to meet with a nutritionist to help you make good choices. Researchers at Mayo Clinic report that only 20% of those with Celiac Disease get a definitive diagnosis. But once they do, it's a lifelong commitment.

"The more you do it, the more you get used to it," Patrick explains. "I want to teach people who don't understand food as well as I do. They need help simplifying life. They can feel overwhelmed." Patrick invites me to his next Gluten Free Dinner event so I can try the foods. "You're going to love it," he assures me. \*

I was standing behind a superhero. He was four feet tall and could barely see over the counter. "I like shrimp in my bowl," he told the server at PokeHub. His mom suggested he try kale, but the superhero refused. "I'll take seaweed," he said. His mother looked pleased.

Maybe you love it. Maybe you haven't tried it yet, but one thing to know about Poke (pronounced Poh-Keh) is this healthful bowl of ingredients is like a taste of the tropics in a bowl.

Poke's origins are distinctly Hawaiian. The islanders have eaten some form of it for centuries. The pre-Colonial seafood dish literally means "to cut crosswise into pieces." They prepared their fresh catch of the day—usually octopus or small reef fish—by slicing, salting and then serving it with seaweed. Other additions might be algae and candlenuts—both are indigenous to Hawaii. With the ocean's bounty on their plate, Hawaiians ate some form of poke on a regular basis. Today, they often choose from 20 different versions of poke at grocery stores, surf shacks and gas stations. Seafood is typically sold by the pound, and rice costs extra. Then they put it in a cardboard box for you to take to the beach, work or home.

The classic poke proteins are octopus or raw ahi tuna, marinated for at least one hour in soy and sesame (although today in America, salmon is the most requested). The poke movement in mainland America began on the West Coast, especially coastal cities like San Diego and Los Angeles. Then, poke restaurants began turning up in urban areas around the country. At this





writing, Northern Virginia has 11 restaurants dedicated to poke, but you will see poke dishes on restaurant menus as well.

Chloe Lee and her husband Brendan Lee own PokeHub in Reston Town Center. The Lee's are from Orange County, California, where they had a popular poke restaurant before most East Coast residents had ever heard of poke. Chloe wanted to live near her mother in Fairfax County, and the Lee's felt Northern Virginia had excellent schools and was an ideal place to raise their kids. They sold their restaurant in California and opened up PokeHub about 18 months ago.

PokeHub is not the typical fast-casual poke place. The Lee's want people to come in several times a week, so they offer an extensive variety of possibilities for enjoying their poke. You can even have chicken and tofu. For your base, choose from white or brown rice, tortilla chips, salad mixes or a burrito version—your selections are wrapped in seaweed like a sushi roll. There's even a kid's bowl, for your superhero.

Chloe is a fresh food fanatic, so she prefers to serve her seafood raw, rather than marinated in advance. "I don't like the seafood to get





mealy," she says. The line staff takes the ingredients you choose for your poke bowl and mixes them together with the sauces of your choice before serving them. PokeHub has far more seafood choices then most poke restaurants. Select from ahi tuna, seared Albacore tuna, salmon, eel, scallops and shrimp. "We cut each fish as needed, so they stay fresh," says Chloe. I watched them clean up at the end of lunch. Nothing sits, and the kitchen looked immaculate.

Chloe says that there are poke places all over California, but only the really good ones survive. She tried to sell the concept of poke to several developers when she first moved to the DC Area, but found them skeptical. "When we asked the people of Reston Town Center, they were familiar with the product, and agreed," Chloe says. PokeHub was one of the first in Northern Virginia, and it fits in well with the modern lineup of dining options. The Lee's are opening additional locations in Oakton and near the Capital One Center.

A wide variety of toppings awaits diners at PokeHub. I adored the pickled cucumbers and the Masago (fish eggs), sweet crab, wasabi and furikake—a combination of dried seaweed, sesame seeds and dried fish. Several of these ingredients cost extra, so don't add them haphazardly. I tried the traditional sauce—Yuzu Ponzo and Sesame Shuyu, but spicelovers might prefer the wasabi mayo or PokeHub's custom-blended hot sauce. "We make all our sauces in house," Chloe adds.

On another afternoon, I stopped at Lei'd Hawaiian Poke Shop next to Tysons Corner where I found a steady stream of customers. For the base of Lei'd's poke, choose from white or brown sushi rice, soba noodles,





Matcha edamame rice and nachos. Then build your bowl with proteins, either salmon, tuna or shrimp in pre-marinated sauces like Gangnam style, Sea Salt Limu (lime), Red Volcano and some conventional sauces like Siracha or Yuzu.

Select a few toppings—I recommend the diced mango and Hot Cheeto Crunch. There are lots of combinations, but sometimes too many toppings can obscure the star of the dish—raw fish. But I'll leave that to you to decide.

With its growing popularity, Hawaiians are enjoying the enthusiasm for their regional dish, but some experts worry about the sustainability of featuring fish at a fast-casual restaurant. And although it's not customary to add pineapple and avocado, it makes your bowl look infinitely more Instagrammable. Hawaiians like to say the poke we eat in the U.S. is California Poke, not Hawaiian Poke. Either way, this healthy, flavorful meal in a bowl just might make you feel like a superhero. ��



# TYSON'S CORNER AT THE EPICENTER OF THE INTERNET

he origin of Tyson's Corner at the epicenter of the internet dates back to the Civil War when the Union took advantage of the heightened elevation (Tyson's is among the highest points in Fairfax) to construct a lookout tower. The army took timber from nearby farms for its construction. A century later, the US military would use the elevation advantage to build a radio tower in the same space for sending and transmitting messages during the Cold War. This satellite tower, decked in white and red, can still be seen today at the intersection of Chain Bridge Road and Leesburg Pike adjacent to the water tower.

However, the birth of the internet as we know it occurred in a far less conspicuous segment of the landscape: An office building at 8100 Boone Boulevard that is now obscured by a McDonald's. At one point 25 years ago, half the internet's traffic ran through there.

In the early '90s, the connection of computers to one another in an intranet configuration was relatively common but leveraging that technology towards a world-wide reach was a different matter. At the time, those pathways were strictly regulated by the government and only used by a select few: Mostly the academic world, selected scientific communities, and sectors of the government and military.

The problem was mainly that of infrastructure which was, again, controlled by the government (specifically the National Science Foundation). Steven Feldman, who had worked linking networks for a company called MFS Datanet, had to use existing phone lines. When he worked in Northern Virginia, Feldman and some colleagues from competing companies—including MFS's former landlord Sprint—decided to join forces to create their own infrastructure using the tower nearby.

Tech writer Andrew Blum wrote in his book "Tubes":

"Each of these networks operated independently, but they knew full well that they were useless without one another... The growth trend was clear: for the good of the internet—really if there was to be a functioning nonacademic internet at all—the networks had to act as one."

The business partners created Metropolitan Area East. The new platform got a boost from a 1991 Congressional initiative called the "High Performance Computing and Communication Act" which was created amidst in internet arms race with other electronics superpowers such as Japan. The bill acknowledged the need to transfer the development of the internet from government to industry and set forth steps to strengthen the existing infrastructure.

A year after being constructed in 1993, MFS got the funding and expanded with data nodes in suburban Philadelphia, San Francisco and Chicago. Despite covering a huge share of the world's circulated information, the operation managed until 1996 in just one floor of the 8100 Boone Boulevard. However, the increasing spatial demands of cramming so many fiber cables started to become too much. The operation moved next door into a control center carved out of a parking garage in 1919 Gallows Road.

MAE-East closed off to new customers in 1998 and the original mainframe was shut down in 2001. In 2009, many of the original service providers (including AT&T) migrated to a competing firm in Ashburn.

Some sources such as the Internet Exchange Map suggests MAE-East is, in fact, no longer an active part of the internet's existence. At the same time, MAE-East's growth must be partially credited with Tyson's Corner's status as one of the largest economic hubs in the country.

Meanwhile, the senator who proposed the 1991 Act that gave MAE-East its leg up in the market and its ability to put Tyson's on the map, was none other than Al Gore. While his role in the bill (dubbed "the Gore Bill") would lead to backlash of exaggeration in his presidential campaign nine years later, it's difficult to think of any lawmaker who did more to realize the internet's potential. Much of his time in the Senate would be spent pushing forth technocratic legislation and while he didn't coin the term superhighway, he would popularize it in the early 90s.





Cy the Cynic has gone through dozens of 'regular' partnerships. He defines a partner as someone who sticks by you through troubles you wouldn't have if your partner were someone else.

Today's North was strangely reluctant to bid notrump: he could have opened 1NT or tried 3NT over South's invitiational three hearts. Game in notrump would succeed easily, but against four hearts, Cy, sitting West, led a diamond. East took dummy's jack with the king and returned the eight of spades to Cy's ace.

'I knew he might have led a singleton spade,' Cy told me, 'but what if he'd led from a doubleton? From his viewpoint, I might hold the king of spades instead of the ace, and he might need to set up a spade trick before declarer used dummy's clubs for a discard.'

I nodded in agreement.

'So I returned a diamond to get our second diamond trick,' Cy went on. 'We got it, but declarer took the rest, drawing trumps with a finesse. My partner was ready to kill me for not giving him his ruff.

I sympathized with Cy. It's easy to construct a deal in which East must lead a spade at Trick 2 (from any holding) to win a spade, two diamonds and a trump trick. Moreover, East could make the defense easy by winning the first diamond with the ace and leading a spade. Since East's play of the ace of diamonds would have seemed to deny possession of the king, Cy would have no choice but to take the asce of spades and return a spade, hoping East would ruff.


